

"How is my Child Progressing": Assessment by Professor Stephen Greene

Many parents wish to have a regular review of their child's health and assess their progress against the expected normal rate of development. This is for reassurance, and also for the detection of any issues which if identified early and, if necessary, can be directed to specialist advice and therapy.

The 'How is My Child Progressing' evaluation at London Medical consists of:

• Registration and completion of a short online child health assessment form in the London Medical App/Website.

The information logged in the online registration form will be measured against the expected health, growth and developmental 'milestones' for the child's age and reviewed by the Consultant Paediatrician.

Then, depending on the parents' wishes, either:

- A "Video Consultation" (~30 min) with the parents and the child, undertaken by the Consultant Paediatrician who has reviewed the on-line information. At the consultation, the specialist will check the current health and development status of the child with the parents against expected standard milestones and discuss any specific issues raised.
- A joint decision will be made with the parents to consider if there is a need for further review or assessment and or referral to appropriate specialist paediatric services

Or

- A 'Face to Face' meeting at London Medical Clinic (~45-60 min) which would include the review of the on-line information together with a detailed clinical history and physical examination of the child.
- Again, a joint decision will be made with the parents to consider if there is a need for further review or assessment and or referral to appropriate specialist paediatric services.
